

Referendum Returns Show Growers Favor Flue-Cured Program By Nine To One

Washington, July 6th.—The Agricultural Adjustment Administration announced today that virtually complete returns from the referendum, conducted in June to determine whether flue-cured tobacco growers desire an adjustment program to follow the one which operates with the current season, show that of the 83.3 percent of the eligible voters voting, 95.2 percent voted in favor of an extension of the program.

All share-croppers, share-tenants, renters and landowners engaged in the production of flue-cured tobacco were eligible to vote in the referendum. Flue-cured is produced chiefly in North Carolina, South Carolina, Virginia, Georgia and Florida. Returns received through today accounted for 225,890 persons eligible to vote in the referendum.

Of the number of eligible voters, 188,163, or 83.3 percent, actually voted. Of those voting, 184,755, or 98.2 percent, voted in favor of a program to follow the one which expires this season and 3,408, or 1.8 percent, voted against such a program.

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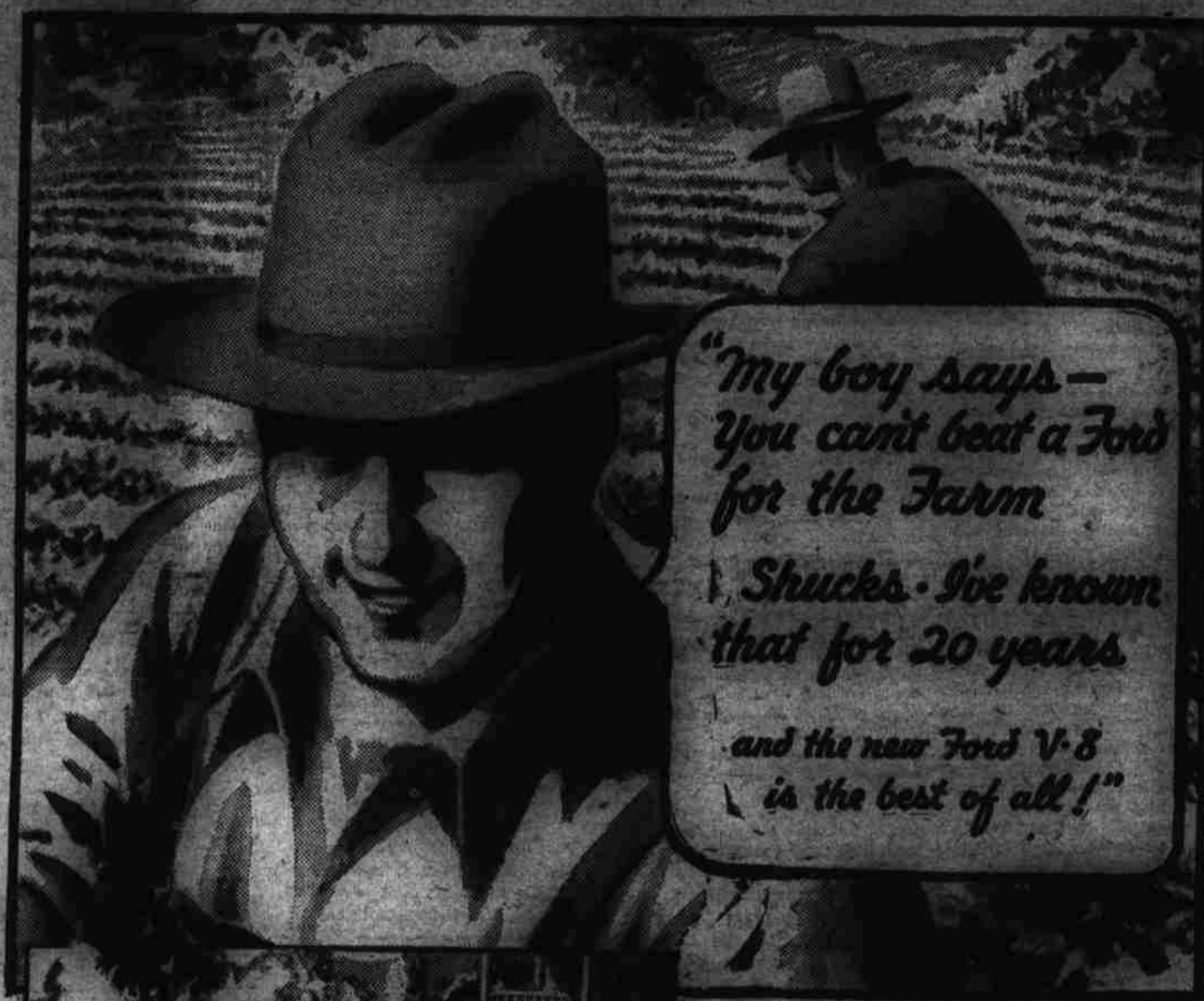


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
