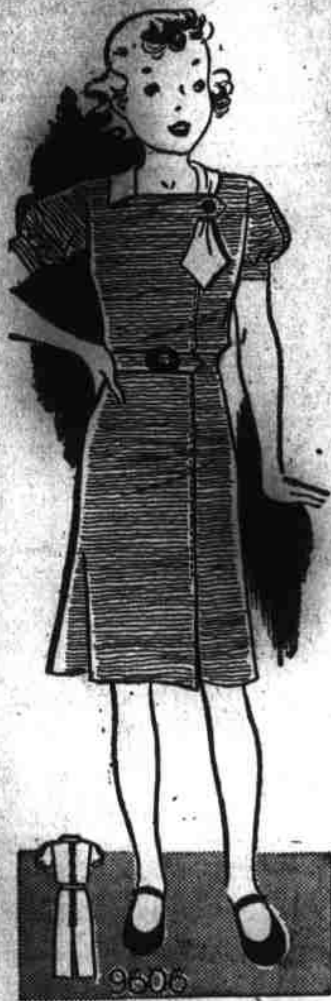


LET JUNIOR MAKE OWN SIMPLE FROCK

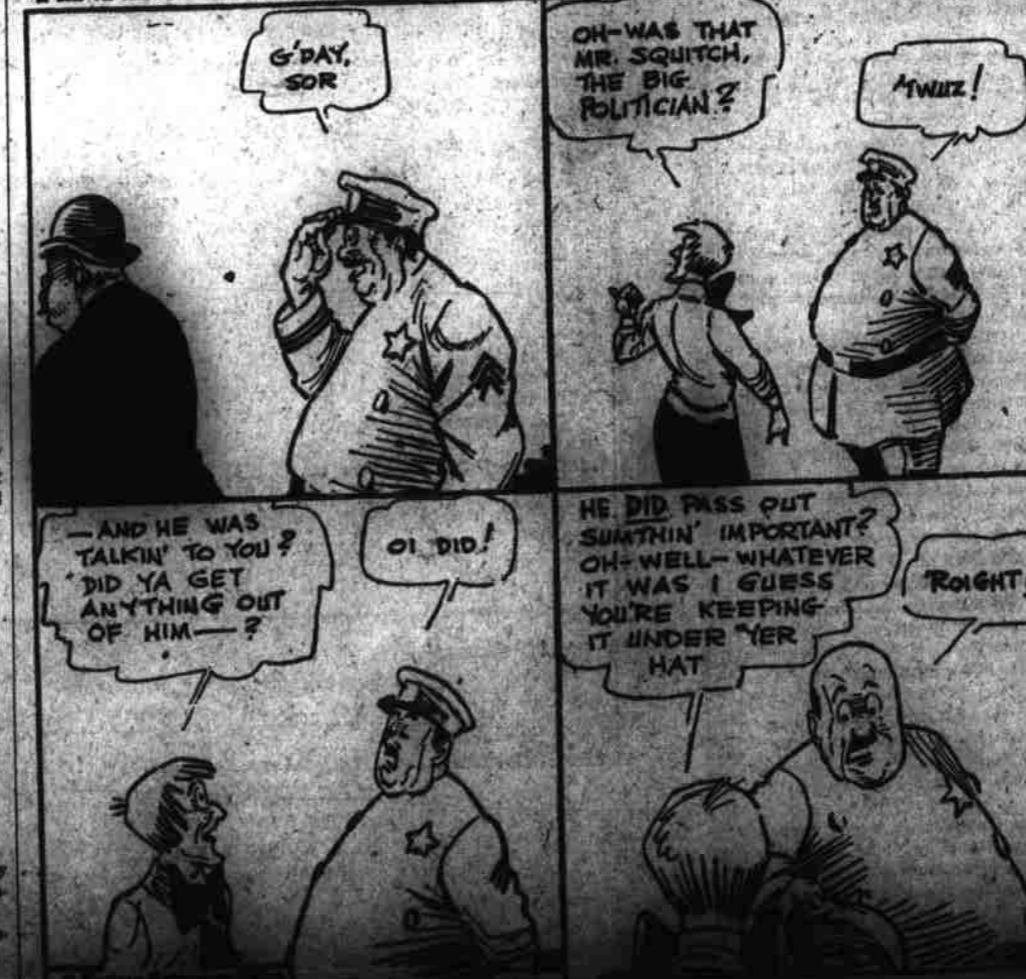
