## Duplin County Joins In State-Wide Education Program For Temperance

January 31st has been designated as Temperance Field Day in Duplin County. During the last twelve months, each Sunday a Temperance Field Day has been held in one or more Counties in the State, at which time anywhere from 25 to 75 Churches have participated in each respective County. Usually these meetings are held under the joint sponsorship of the United Dry Forces of North Carolina and the Ministerial Associations in the participating Counties and Cities. The purpose of these meetings is to inform the people regarding the harmful effects of strong drink and to stimulate greater interest in the fight against the liquor traffic.

The Temperance Field Day for Duplin County is being arranged

by the United Dry Forces of North Carolina and several leading Ministers in Duplin County. It is earnestly hoped that at 11 o'clock on January 31st every Church in Duplin County will have a Temperance address or sermon. Insofar as possible, it is hoped that each Church will accept a temperance speaker to be furnished by the committee in charge of the meetings. However, in case of Church that does not desire a guest speaker, it is urged that the Pastor preach a temperance sermon on the 31st.

Rev. F. L. Goodman of Kenansville, representing the Ministers of Duplin County, and Miss Macy Cox of Magnolia, representing the Duplin County Organization, are cooperating with State Headquarters in arranging the meetings. All Ministers with Churches in Duplin County are urged to communicate with Cale K. Burgess at Raleigh in order to perfect arrangements for their Churches to participate in the Temperance Field Day on the 31st.
