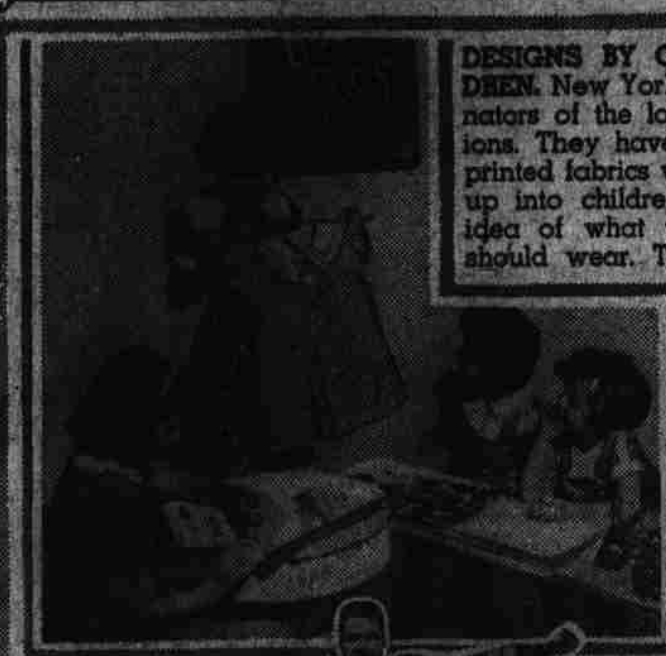
What do you care for pedestrians and red lights? You pay taxes, don't you? You've got a license, haven't you? Sure, you own the road...

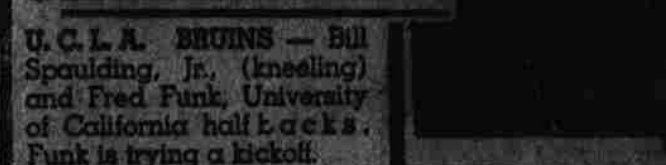
