**EYE CLINIC**

The County Health and Welfare Departments cooperating with the State Blind Commission held a clinic in the offices of the health department, Kenansville, February 25th and 26th.

Miss Alice Kerr, Field Worker for the State Blind Commission assisted in the clinic. Dr. Robert O. Page, head specialist, Kinston made the examinations.

Mrs. Irene E. Hufham, Nurse; Mrs. Ruth L. Honeycutt, Clerk; and Dr. E. L. Carr, Health Officer, assisted in the two days work.

The County Welfare Superintendent and the Principals of the white schools rendered splendid cooperation in getting patients to the clinic. Ninety-five percent of those examined were school children; of that number twenty-five were fitted with glasses; two referred for special treatment, and one referred to the blind school at Raleigh.

Requests for a similar clinic revealed that another will probably be held in the early fall.

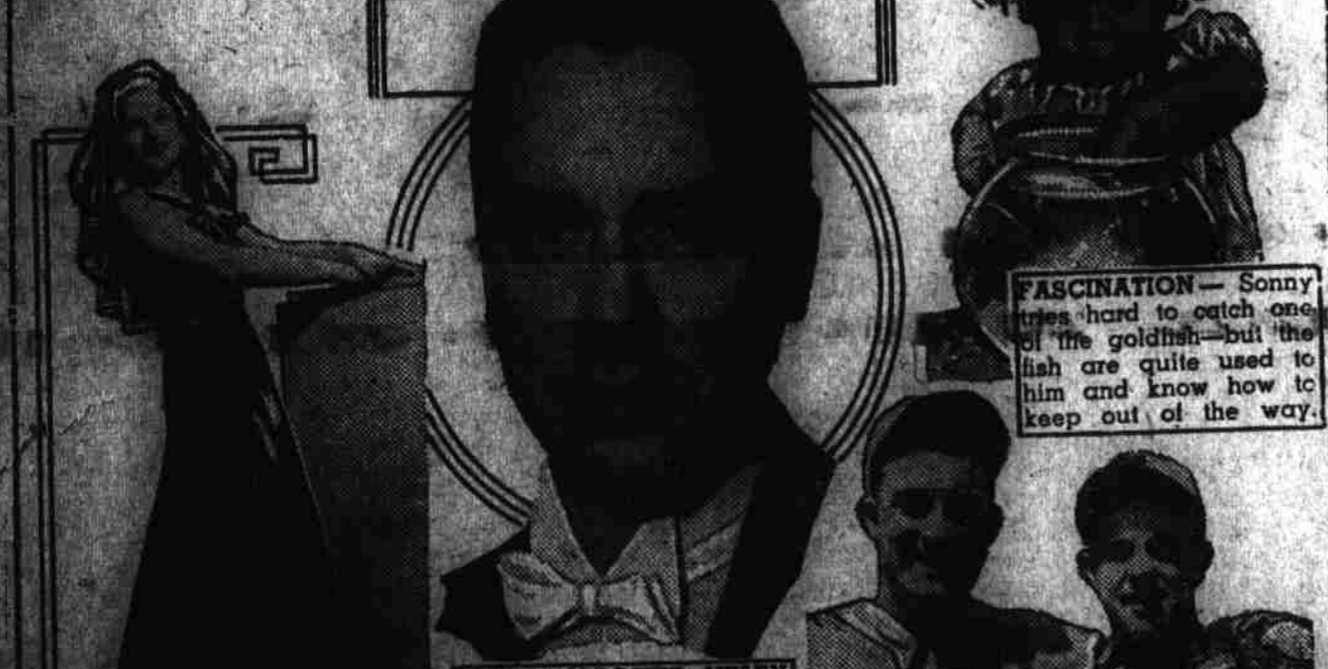
