**Dr. Ralph McDonald Goes To Forsythe Sanatorium; One Lung Is Infected**

RALEIGH, March 5th — Dr. Ralph W. McDonald, anti-sales tax candidate for governor in Democratic primaries last year, was taken to Winston-Salem, his home, by ambulance from Rex Hospital here Thursday. Doctors who treated the former legislator and college professor said he was suffering from a slight infection in one lung and would be confined to the Forsyth County Tubercular Sanatorium, where he was admitted for several months. They added, however, that his condition was extremely satisfactory and that there was no doubt that he would recover completely

and as rapidly as possible under the circumstances. Dr. McDonald was taken to Rex Hospital last week from his hotel room here when he suffered a relapse after an attack of influenza several weeks ago. His condition after several days of treatment, was reported as good. A Democrat, but an insurgent against the regular party organization, Dr. McDonald waged a stiff campaign for the party's nomination for governor last summer. In the first primary, with four candidates in the race, he finished a close second to the present governor, Clyde R. Hoey of Shelby, for the nomination, and lost the run-

off primary by approximately 80,000 votes. The ambulance carrying the political leader to Winston-Salem left Rex Hospital at 9:30 a. m. Mrs. McDonald accompanied her husband on the trip.

**May Give Employees Protection**

RALEIGH, March 5. — Many thousands of employers in North Carolina who do not come under the provisions of the State Unemployment Compensation Act because they do not have as many as eight employees or because they are engaged in excluded classes of work, if they so desire, may give their employees the protection of the act by voluntarily bringing themselves under its provisions, Chairman Charles G. Powell, of the State Commission, point out.

Figures compiled in the commission's office indicate that there are probably 20,000 employers in the State who have from one to seven employees. They are excluded from the list of those whose workers are covered by the unemployment compensation provisions of the act, but they have the privilege of electing to come under the act. By this election their employees would receive the same kind of protection as the workers in larger organizations. The act excludes the smaller employers primarily because of the trouble in administering the act, particularly while the operation of the act is just beginning. It may be changed to include them later. Also, employers in excluded classes of work, including agricultural labor, domestic service in homes, work for religious, charitable, scientific, literary and educational purposes, and all non-profit organizations, such as private schools, colleges and hospitals may come under the act and give the employees the same protection as is enjoyed by those in included classes of work. Employers not included because of the small number of workers or the type of employment, who wish to protect their workers to that

extent, may apply for voluntary coverage on blanks furnished by the commission. The commission passes on these applications and approves them unless there is some just reason for not doing so. Such voluntary employers are required to stay under the act for two full years, and to give notice at least 30 days before the end of a calendar year before they are permitted to withdraw.
