Modern Fertilizing Methods

Recent studies in the mechanical application of fertilizers to cotton will furnish the subject for a radio talk on the Carolina Farm Features program Saturday, March 20.

Dr. Emerson B. Collins, agronomist at the North Carolina Experiment Station, will explain in the broadcast the progress which has been made along this line.

The experiments in fertilizer placement around cotton were started in 1931 and practically the same placements were used in 1932 and 1933. The outline of the experiment was revised in 1934 to take advantage of the information obtained in the previous years.

Some of the placements which had proved but of little value were dropped and other placements that offered promise were added. The second outline was carried out in 1934 and 1935, and revised for the 1936 season.

The experimental plots are located at the Upper Coastal Plain Experimental Station near Rocky Mount on a Norfolk sandy loam soil.
