QUESTION: What makes butter stick to the pan?
ANSWER: There are several causes for butter sticking to the pan. It may be that the pan is not well greased. Or, there may be too much sugar in the recipe. Always use a tested recipe and measure accurately.

QUESTION: What makes a butter cake dry?
ANSWER: Too much flour or too much sugar may cause a butter cake to be dry. Always use a tested recipe and measure accurately.

QUESTION: How much grease should one put on the griddle when making griddle cakes?
ANSWER: Ordinary griddles should be greased lightly each time the batter is added. However, with the new griddle pan of the Hotpoint range (which also serves as a drip pan in the broiler) one needs only to grease it lightly at first. It is not necessary to grease it between "tryings."

To Chop Nut Meats

About Social Security Law

"Although Title VIII of the Social Security law, of the Federal Government has been effective since January 1, 1937 and pertains to a Federal tax on employers and employees" it still remains that it is obvious to Raymond D. Christman, deputy collector, whose headquarters are in Wilmington, and embraces fifteen of the Eastern Carolina counties, that there are many who are still of the opinion that they do not come within the provisions of the law.

"There are two separate titles to the law," says Mr. Christman, and where an individual, corporation or firm employs **EVEN ONE PERSON**, that one person is subject to the tax and such tax is to be retained by the employer at the time wages are paid and such tax is to be paid to the government following each month of collection.

Title IX of the act pertains to the employer of eight or more persons and that law became effective for the year of 1936 and the tax is based upon 1 per cent of the payroll for the entire year. The employe pays no tax under this title.

There are fines and penalties for failure to make returns and pay tax under both titles and such penalties range from 5 per cent per month on to \$10,000 in addition to imprisonment, and the obligation rests entirely with every employer to secure information relating to his or her status, and "therefore," states Mr. Christman, "delinquent tax returns carries fixed penalties," and he suggests that instead of "waiting for a deputy," to call upon persons coming within the purview of the law, it would be well for such taxpayers Form SS-1 are used in execut-
