2. The New Testament says that Abraham saw "My Day" and was glad. What truth about Christ does Abraham reveal? (a) The need of Christ. Sin is the whole situation when Abraham came on the scene. Then a message about Sin. (b) The Sacrifice of Christ. Abraham was asked to offer his only beloved son, and the New Testament says, He is the only Begotten Son. Both Abraham and God offered their sons on Mount Moriah. (c) The Resurrection of Christ. Hebrews says that Abraham offered up his son believing that he would live again and fulfill his mission. Jesus always announced his resurrection along with His death. Abraham's faith in the future life of his son is echoed again by Paul when he says that the resurrection of Jesus is the foundation of the Gospel.

3. Abraham and Salvation. We have already noted the need for salvation. Here both Abraham and the New Testament Gospel point to faith as the means. Paul writing to Rome says that Abraham was justified by Faith and not works. That sounds much like the Gospel. We see that as in Christ so also in Abraham is the promise of the eternal salvation. Both had the "everlasting covenant." A promise that reached into the eternal. Both had the universal gospel. "All nations shall be blessed" and "Preach to all nations."

'33 Plow-up Cotton Option Pool Now Being Closed

The cotton Option Pool in Washington, in connection with the 1933 plow-up campaign is now being closed and all Duplin County producers who have not already received their second distribution and who holds a Participation Trust Certificate Form No. 8-6-D (yellow) should at once bring the certificate to the County Agent's office and sign the necessary form in order to receive the remaining 2c per pound, less expense, now being held for them in Washington says Mr. Reynolds, County Agricultural Agent for Duplin County.

If, on the other hand a producer holds a Certificate (Tax only) No. C-6-1 which indicates that he has already received his second distribution and received up to 12c for his pooled cotton and the certificate is worthless and it is with the slowest working
