

YOUR WASHINGTON and MINE From Behind the Scenes

Washington, Sept. 28.—Elihu's learned Senator, William E. Borah, universally loved, but upon whom his own party signally failed to bestow national honors, in his injured role as premier Constitutional order proclaims that the Supreme Court is "the final judge between the people, their agents and servants," and urges the U. S. Congress alone under the Constitution.

The learned Senator Borah, leading actor in the dramatic fight against President Roosevelt's court reorganization plan, and worshiper at the shrine of Abraham Lincoln, also calls upon the country to keep unimpaired the independence of the Supreme Court, apparently forgetting that anything Mr. Roosevelt now proposes assumes a graciously benign aspect when compared with the things Mr. Lincoln actually did.

The Maryland legislature was due to convene September 17, 1861, another Constitution Day anniversary. Mr. Lincoln, fearing disloyalty and Maryland's desertion to the Confederacy, caused the arrest and imprisonment of several legislators, but, there being no good and sufficient charge against them, the United States Supreme

Court ruled that they were illegally held, and Mr. Chief Justice Taney ordered their release. But they were NOT released. Lincoln also voided the right of habeas corpus, caused certain newspaper offices to be raided and many publications suspended, in open defiance of the First Amendment. He raised armies and carried on war against the seceding states, although this power is invested in Congress alone under the Constitution.

Mr. Lincoln was right! When the President is doing the obviously correct and popular thing, all water runs to his mill, but let him once step out and bruise the toes of the modern wallers at the wall of lost patronage, then he needs must return home by the weeping cross.

President Lincoln could, and did. President Roosevelt cannot, and won't. Yet these professedly sincere lovers of Lincoln and critics of Roosevelt would make charges of one and chalk of the other. Lincoln faced a condition of open rebellion, and his acts were justified by emergency and acute necessity casting the mantle of authority thereover. Roosevelt did not have to contend with armed

rebellion. The problem he faced was not that of preserving the Union, but of feeding the Union. Lincoln had solved.

In 1862 and '63 big men, bludgeoned from hunger, respected women, wives and mothers emaciated and made frail in the desperate struggle for food, any kind of food mattering not how coarse or unsuited, just enough to save their ragged and shivering progeny from disease and starvation, helpless babes, their hunger-plagued faces making them to look like little old men, withering and dying in their innocence, simply because there was too much food, because the psychology of fear and over-supply had bankrupted not only the producers but potential consumers as well, thereby creating such a depression that nobody could buy even the most needful things.

Secession was rebellion and could not be tolerated. Lincoln was right! But, seventy-one years later, seeing their children starve in the midst of plenty brought heart-break to jobless men who were anxious to work. And the pitiful, pleading whimpering sobs of his unfed baby, even though made in broken whispers through the unquiet slumber of sick life, can thunder louder in a man's soul than any gun at Fort Sumter.
