Sunday School Lesson
Oct. 10, 1937
THE CHRISTIAN BROODS FEEDS
Text: Luke 14:15-16
This week we are studying the whole book of Jude. Read it three several times and see if you can find the messages therein. Jude is dealing with a time of corruption in the church! They abused the sanctified, but instead they are growing worse. Sanctified here as elsewhere in the Bible means growing more and more like Christ. Jude describes some of these people whose names are on the church roll and who are "in good standing" in the church, yet who are living lives of sin.

Note carefully how he describes them. Does that sound like the religion of today. Men are making themselves God. They are wearing the cloak of righteousness, but underneath they are living in sin. Jude goes on and states that even though such exist and spoil the condition of the church, yet God will bring sure punishment of eternal fire. Then turning to the few who are trying to be faithful he says, Beware of these wolves in sheep's clothing.

How can we meet this condition. First, contend for your faith. Are men as zealous for their faith as for their politics? Don't compromise but hold firmly to the faith in Jesus Christ. Hold fast to that which you have that no man take it from you. But it is not enough just to hold on to the faith we must "Build" yourself in Faith, Bible, Prayer and the Holy Spirit will build up your faith if you will so them. Jude says that we need to grow in faith for our own good and also that we may refute the world. The slack attitude of the world toward the church today is the result of a church membership of heartless and faithless people. We are just drifting so what else can the world believe about the church. Refute every argument against the church by Christian living.

Jude goes one step further. The powers of the world are wrong and you are weak. Except for God's keeping, our efforts would be in vain. How discouraging is the thought that the Christian is always apt to fall back into the old sins. Here, Jude says Christ will keep you. It is the old doctrine of the Perseverance of the Saints. The New Testament argument is this. If Christ has the power to reach into sin and lift fallen men from sin, and if Christ does reach into sin and lift men from that state, then certainly He not only has the power to keep that person from sin, but He also will exercise that power and lift that one out of sin. If you have really given your heart to Jesus, then you can rest assured that you will keep that heart until the day of glorification. The New Testament is full of that truth. your own hope on God. How can we hear men say, "I am afraid that I can't hold out." Well, you give your heart to Jesus and don't have to hold out. He does that for you.

In a day of slack religion like we have today, let's assert our faith in Christ, let's realize that He can keep our souls and then let's tell others that He can keep them too. Will you do that for your Savior.
