CLINTON READY FOR HUGE CROWDS AT FAIR NEXT WEEK

The Clinton Fair Association is near completion of plans for the fair to begin there October 28, which is expected to carry on the tradition that Clinton fairs are second to none.

The fair this year has received a great deal of attention in regard to making it convenient for the people of the section to attend, and every attraction has been checked in order to get the cleanest and most entertaining program available.

Admission prices at the main gate have been reduced from 50c to 40c. This admission fee entitles the person entering to see a large program of free acts before the grandstand. These free acts are to be staged every night during the fair, and include such well-known entertainers as Hoagland's Auto Polo, along with an impressive array of talent.

All exhibit space and refreshment booths have been sold, and the fairgrounds have been remod-

eled and whitewashed for the event. Approximately \$3500.00 in prizes is to be given for the best exhibits.

Action will begin Tuesday morning with a parade through Clinton to the fairgrounds. A program of the featured events for each day is:

Tuesday: School children's day for Sampson, Duplin and adjoining counties. All schoolchildren are urged to attend, as this day has been especially appointed for them and their pleasure.

REV. V. G. SMITH
REORGANIZES CHINGUAPIN

Rev. V. G. Smith, who has been pastor of the Chinguapin group of churches for the last 8 years, resigned from the Chinguapin, Benlerville and Bethel Churches last Sunday and was granted permission by Wilmington Presbytery to leave the presbytery and take up work in Mecklenburg Presbytery near Charlotte. Mr. Smith and family will leave Duplin County the first of November, having resigned to take effect on the last Sunday in October.

Mr. Smith has been serving in Wilmington Presbytery for 14 years having begun his work as a minister at Atkinson and Acme. He is a graduate of Davidson College and Union Theological Seminary. During his stay at Chinguapin he has won many friends. The new educational building has been added to the Chinguapin Church, and progress has been made in the other fields. Besides his regular churches, Mr. Smith has been preaching at mission points in lower Duplin. He leaves many friends, who wish him the greatest success in his new field.
