Three fine mules died of lockjaw in Palmico County in recent months reports County Agent A. T. Jackson.

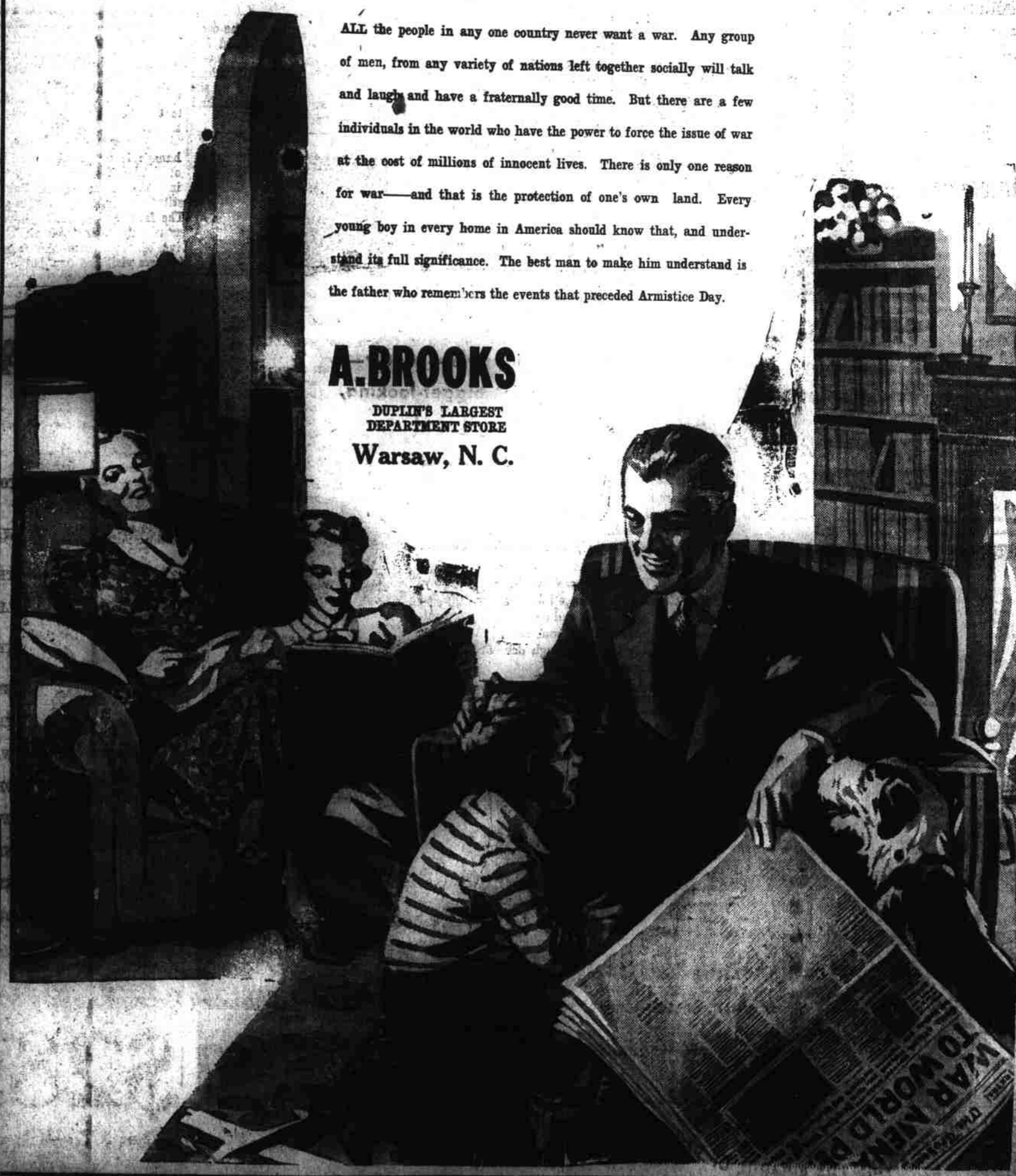
