Coach Hallison and Harrett have done excellent work with their team.



Rowell explained that a large number of market potatoes failed to grade No. 1 last year because of wireworm attacks. The Irish wire-worm, which is the larva of a worm stage of the click beetle, is the spud's deadliest insect enemy. Since wireworms commonly infest soil land, potatoes often suffer severely when planted on recently broken ground. Such luscious crops as clover, alfalfa, field peas, and soybeans are not susceptible to attack. Therefore, potatoes may be planted with a reasonable degree of safety on new land following a three or four year rotation of wireworm immune crops.
