**Social Security
Numbers, if Lost**

Wage earners who have lost
their Social Security account num-
ber cards may now obtain duplicates
from any field office of the
Social Security Board. Mr. Stacey
W. Wade, Manager of the Durham
Field Office, has announced. Formerly
duplicates of account number
cards could be obtained in connection
with the Federal Old-Age Insurance
program could be obtained only
from Washington. The Board
has now instructed field
office managers to issue duplicates
to workers who have lost their
cards provided the worker
can furnish a record of his account
number and other adequate identifi-
cation.

This service to workers, who
have lost their cards has been ad-
ministered to help them obtain em-
ployment. Desires from all parts
of the country indicate, Mr. Wade
explained, that employers are giving
preference to job applicants having
account number cards. This
may be due to the fact that if an
employee fails to obtain an account
number the employer must make
application for a number for this
worker. The employer is required
to include both the worker's name
and his account number in periodic
reports of the worker's wages
which he files with the Treasury.

Field office managers have been
instructed by the Board to obtain
various requesting duplicate cards.
It was explained that this additional
information is required so that if it is found necessary the
Board can communicate with the
wage earner or his employer.

J. L. McNeill of Mitchell County
solved the problem of obtaining
a card for his dairy cows by creat-
ing two sets of stock books, one
10 or 12 sets of each.
