Services began at 2:15; opened by the choir, prayer by Rev. E. J. Middleton followed by another selection by the choir after which Mrs. Sarah Newton sang a solo, "Waiting For Me."

After the pastor's remarks, the casket was opened and the family and friends taken their last view of one who, throughout life, did good, not only in church life, but in private life as well.

The choir led with another selection with Mrs. Sallie Middleton playing the piano very softly as the sexton, Bill Brown started tolling the bell.

Interment was at Middleton's Cemetery, 1 mile from Kenansville on the Wilmington Highway. Surviving are her husband, Johnnie Lee Faison; one small adopted girl, Mildred; her father, Will Swan and a number of sisters and brothers.

There was an offering taken for the bereaved family at the church and the floral tributes were beautiful.
