## Opening Tobacco Market News Report Georgia And Florida Flue-Cured

July 24, 1947

Auction sales of the 1947 crop of Georgia and Florida flue-cured tobacco began today with the better quality offerings bringing from \$8 to \$8 per hundred more than on opening day last season. According to the United States Department of Agriculture the largest increases occurred for fair and good cutters and fair to choice lugs. In contrast, most low lugs and all lower leaf offerings dropped \$1 to \$5 per hundred. Best thin nondescript showed an extreme loss of \$8.75. All but a few grades averaged from \$1 to \$10.50 per hundred over the Commodity Credit Corporation support price. A few of the better cigarette type grades failed by as much as \$4 to reach the support level. It was estimated that approximately 20 per cent of the baskets were rejected on some markets and delivered to the Flue-cured Stabilization Corporation at Commodity Credit Corporation support prices.

The general quality of the offerings as a whole was better than on opening day last season. Some markets reported tobacco of lower quality but the belt generally sold more good to choice lugs and more primings while considerably less leaf grades were marketed. Bulk of sales consisted mainly of fair to fine lugs and fair cutters and leaf.

Lowest price of the day was \$4 for individual lots of poorest nondescript which carried no support price while the top on some markets was around \$60 for an occasional basket of better cutters. Last year on opening extreme prices ranged from \$5 to \$52 for the same grades. The bulk of sales ranged from \$45 to \$52 per hundred. Heavy sales were reported on all

markets. Gross sales opening day last year amounted to 8,896,020 pounds at an average of \$44.26 per hundred. The estimated general average for morning sales this year on several markets ranged from \$42 to \$45.

## First Weed Sales Average \$43.92 In Georgia And Florida

Georgia and Florida tobacco growers sold 15,661,526 pounds of flue-cured leaf in the first two days of the 1947 marketing season, at an average of 43.92 cents a pound, the U. S. Department of Agriculture announced. Receipts totaled \$6,878,661.

The average was 1.45 cents a pound lower than the record opening week of last year, but it was the second highest week in history of the Ga.-Fla. belt.

Cutters and better quality lugs were from one to five cents a pound higher than opening week last year, but the department of agriculture reported most leaf grades, primings nondescripts and poor-quality lugs were lower.

Leaf grades were from one to 13 cents off, with lower quality lugs and primings from one to four cents lower. Declines on nondescript ranged from 5.35 to 8.35 cents a pound. Greatest declines were shown in the lowest grades.

The market opened July 24 in 18 Georgia and three Florida markets. A number of Duplin farmers have sold early primings in Georgia.
