Whether the tarpon Tom Eaton of Hatteras took on hook and line in Pamlico Sound last week is a million-dollar baby, or just another luckless straggler is the question Carolina sportsmen were debating this week.

If the fish Eaton landed was just a stray tarpon who took the hook through some freakish misadventure, then he will mean no more than any of the occasional rare specimens yielded by the waters around Hatteras.

But this fish was landed after much deliberate exploratory work.

It was figured that if concentrations can be found, the right time chosen, the right bait and methods employed, then the tarpon definitely can be added to the list of sport fishing available in North Carolina.
