## New Forest Fire Law Is Recommended

A new law in North Carolina making it unlawful to let out woods fires before 4:30 p. m. from February 15 to May 15 each year will be asked of the next legislature by a committee representing the local work of Southern States Forestfire Commission, Inc., is announced in a bulletin sent the Times last week.

This amendment to the state regulation on forest fires is calculated to reduce destruction caused by fires getting out from new ground, turnip bed and tobacco seed beds each Spring. Those who are to do any burning will also be required to notify three of their nearest neighbors at least 24 hours in advance, the bulletin states. This new protective aid for timber growers has already been enacted by the Virginia Legislature, and automobile bumper signs to warn one and all have been distributed by the State Foresters, and which has been the means of saving hundreds of thousands of acres from destruction, the statement further avers.

Much of the burning in this state is due to belief of some farmers that better grazing results and that the grass grows more quickly in the Spring. Such beliefs are disappearing due to discovery by cattle raisers that burnt over pasture gets tough quicker in late Spring and early Summer. Grass in some sage and undergrowth remains partially hidden from the sun and air, and thereby stays tender for cattle longer, the Commission further says in the announcement.

All members of the Southern States Forestfire Commission in this area have been asked to contact their legislators and Senators in behalf of the new measure.

## Carolina Farm Market Summary

Georgia Belle and Hiley peaches made up the bulk of last week's shipments from the Sandhills. Prices held firm at \$3 to \$3.25 f.o.b. Large size watermelons were in firm demand, while small sizes were dull with prices weak. Pepper sales on the Clinton and Faison auction markets were heavy with prices from .75 to 1.40 per bushel. Snap beans failed to improve at western markets and were said to be below production costs.

Hog prices advanced from .50 to 1.00 during the week.

Receipts of cattle were sharply curtailed following last week's late break in prices. Grain-fed steers and heifers regained most of last week's declines and showed advances up to 1.50.

Spring lambs closed steady to .25 under last week's close.

Fryers and broilers opened the week at two cents higher but lost the advance at the close when farm pay prices were at mostly 33 cents. Hens continued dull with prices unchanged.

Eggs were steady with receipts under trade needs. Cotton prices declined during the week.

The Production and Marketing Administration bought 2,103,996 bushels of wheat during the period from noon June 20 to noon of June 27.

There were approximately 340,716,000 laying hens on hand in the U. S. during May.

Commodity Credit Corporation loans will be made to farmers on a note-and-chattel mortgage basis for oats stored on farms and on a basis of a note-and-loan agreement when stored in approved warehouses.
