Southern Farm Market Summary

Closing hog prices at southern points were mostly unchanged this week from a week ago.
Southern cattle producers generally found prices going in 1949 directions. Thin, low-grade cattle sold strong to \$1 higher. Febe-

lows, generally sold steady. Samples of high-grade fat cattle sold weak to as much as \$1 lower.
An irregular trend ruled in major broiler markets. Del-Mar-Va and Shenandoah Valley markets strengthened early in the week from 1 to 1-2 cents. Closing sentiment, however, was weaker.
Cotton prices advanced 20 cents a bale, with Middling 15-16 inch staple averaging 32.46 cents a pound on the 10 spot markets.
