and not cured. The first application should be made when the plants are about the size of a dime. Beginning then is reasonable insurance that the grower will be ahead of blue mold.

How Often Should Treatments Be Applied? Dusts or sprays should be applied twice a week until the plants free of blue mold are assured for transplanting (usually 5 to 12 applications for the season).
