

CP & L Stockholders In Annual Session

Stockholders of Carolina Power & Light Company re-elected all members of the board of directors at their annual meeting last week in Raleigh, and the directors re-elected all the company's officers. The stockholders heard Louis V. Sutton, president, report the company's \$150,000,000 post-war expansion program progressing according to schedule. He said financing of this year's expansion already has been arranged. During this year and the next two years, about \$65,000,000 will be spent for new facilities in addition to the \$85,000,000 already spent since World War II, he said. "I am optimistic about 1952," he said, pointing out that a second 100,000 horsepower unit at Goldsboro will be ready in June and a

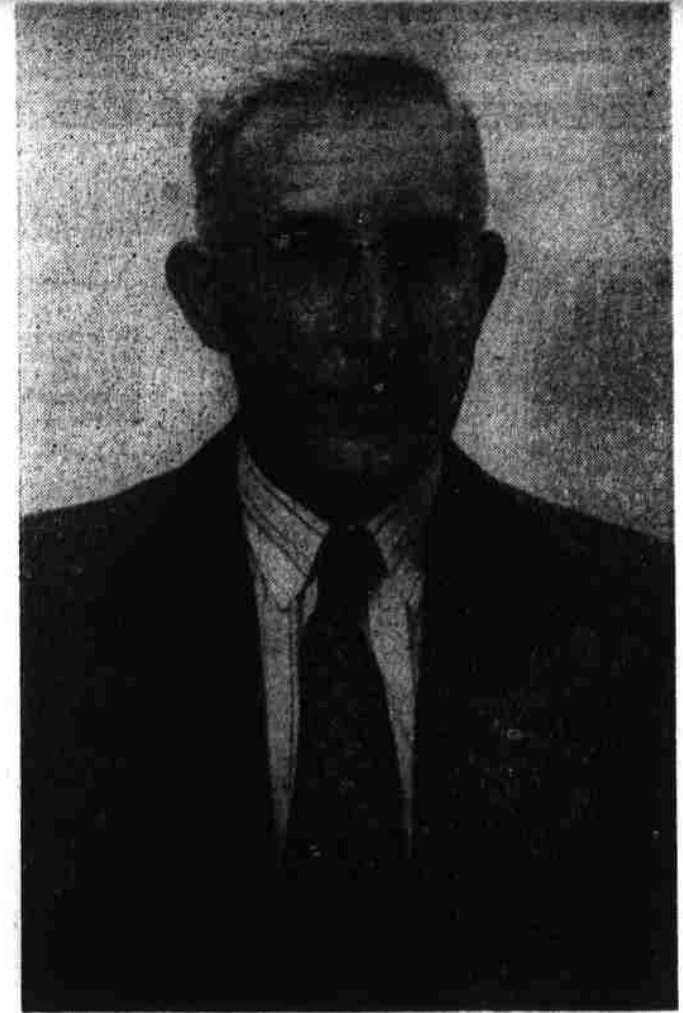
