Next Years Draft Quota To Be Less

WASHINGTON - Secretary of Defense Wilson said last week that, partly because of greater opportunities for peace, draft calls will be halved next year and the armed forces will be reduced by 400,000 men by June, 1956.

The reduction will bring total strength down to 2,815,000 from the current figure of 3,218,000 registered last month.

Wilson told a Pentagon news conference the decision to cut military manpower was made "in the last few weeks" by the president after a review "of all factors."

The secretary also announced that the 1st Marine Division will be returned from Korea to the West Coast, as soon as shipping is assembled. It will be replaced by one of two Army divisions in Japan.

The Army, Navy, Marine Corps, are all to be trimmed in the next 18 months; only the Air Force will be increased in manpower.

Wilson said that among factors influencing the decision, in addition to what he called increased

"Billions of Years Ago" offers and dramatizes the illusion that the Planetarium visitor is witness to the creation of the universe.

Closely followed in the spiritual portion of the program is the Book of Genesis, which is complimented by music and three dimensional effects. Spectacular settings are used to emphasize the "Adam and Eve" story, and the final "Sanctification" scene further emphasizes the relation of spiritual to scientific knowledge.

The entire Planetarium dome is bathed in natural colors twice, once for an underwater panorama showing creatures of the sea and again for depicting prehistoric animals of the past.

Closely linked with the spiritual portion is the scientific part for which Planetarium officials have drawn upon the knowledge of leading scientists and the creative abilities and facilities of Life magazine. Profuse use of portions of the Life series, "The World We Live In," is made in the dramatic show. Too, the magic of the great Zeiss projector is employed to explain some of the theories as to formation of the stars and galaxies, out of chaos, the expanding universe, and the changes of positions of the stars in billions of years.

"Billions of Years Ago" is presented nightly at 8:30 o'clock with matinees Saturdays at 11 a.m., 3 and 4 p.m., and Sundays at 2, 3 and 4 p.m.
