ON BOARD THE USS TULARE—Sydney Liberty is really great, says Harold E. Eubanks, seaman, USN, in an interview on the USS Tulare following the ship's recent goodwill cruise to Sydney, Australia.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. W. G. Eubanks, Beulaville, Harold reported for duty on board the Tulare in August of last year. Assigned to the third division he works with the deck maintenance crew.

'Australians are some of the friendliest people I've ever met,' continued the Beulaville bluejacket. While we were there, it wasn't at all unusual for someone to come up to you on the street and ask you to his home for dinner with the family. We didn't have to pay to ride city buses and trains, and several movie theatres admitted us without tickets.'

Asked what he thought of the food Harold replied, 'They eat more mutton than we do. Other than that the food is about the same as ours. But they serve it differently. Water is never served with a meal. And many places don't have napkins. They put a saucer under everything on the table.'

En route 'down under' the Tulare entered the realm of King Neptune Rex as she crossed the Equator. An initiation was held for the 'pollywogs,' the name given to anyone having never crossed the 'Line' previously. After a man has once crossed the 00-00 degree latitude and experienced the initiation, he is forever known as a 'shellback' and is a member of the 'Royal Order of the Raging Main.'

'The initiation was a lot of fun,' says the seaman. 'I heard a lot about them, and ours was everything I'd expected and then some.
