Seeks Information On Waller Family

This is a part of a letter received from William A. Waller, 2215 Halls Mill Road, Mobile Alabama.

"I am compiling the names and biography of my ancestors. This has been undertaken with a deep and sincere interest in knowing of my ancestors and numerous relatives throughout the country.

Fifer Waller, was born 1824, his My Great Grandfather, Levin Waller, was born in Duplin County, N. C. in 1790, and went to North-east Tennessee about 1830 at about the same time as some or all of his three sons. According to census records Levin Fifer Waller and Levin Waller, Sr. were born in N. C.

John Waller's wife is thought to have been Tempy Southernland and Levin Sr's wife was Charity Jackson.

The 1790 Census for N. C. gave only heads of families, and grouped all members of the family by age. There were four Waller families in Duplin County in that census: Alexander, one male 16 or over, two males under age 16 and three females; John two males 16 or over, two males under 16 and five females; Nathan, one male 16 or over and two females; Nathaniel, one male 16 or over, and one male under 16 and one female.
