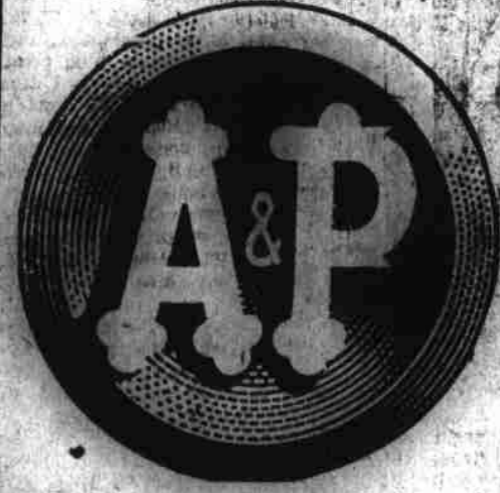
**Couples Canasta
