Gas Tax Refund For Farmers To Be Filed By Oct. 2

Farmers have until October 2, to file an application for the Federal Gasoline Tax Fund due them on all gasoline used for agricultural purposes during the past 12 months. All Federal Tax Refunds on Gasoline are figured on the fiscal year July 1, 1960 to June 30, 1961.

The refund due farmers, who file for the refund, is four cents per gallon of gasoline used for agricultural purposes. Records on the gasoline used are not required to be filed with the return, but they must

be available for inspection. Application blanks are now available at the County Agricultural Agent's office in each County. They are to be filed with the U. S. District Director of Internal Revenue, Greensboro, N. C.
