If at least two-thirds of the growers voting in the referendum approve quotas by voting YES. the law provides that quotas and acreage allotments will be in ef feet for the 1962, 1963 and 1964 crops. Penalties for marketing "excess' tobacco will also be in effect, and price support will be available to growers who comply with their farm acreage allotments.

If marketing quotas are not approved in this referendum there will be no quotas, no acreage allotments, no marketing penalties and no price support on the 1962 crop of lue-cured tobacco. In that event, another vote would be held next year on quotas for the following 3 years.
