Top Farm Award Again Won By N. C. Bankers

The aggressive and diversified farm program conducted by the bankers of North Carolina has again won for them a top national award.
The County Key Banker for Duplin County, Douglas R. Peacock, Vice President, Branch Banking and Trust Company, was advised today that the N. C. Bankers Association has won the top annual Agricultural Award presented by the American Bankers Association with the best record for farm service. This is the 17th consecutive year that the NCBA has won the top award.
Peacock said that during the past year at least 500 bankers actively participated in the various farm projects sponsored by the NCBA.
The projects include a Short Course in Modern Farming at State College, attended by about 150 young farmers; a two-day farm credit conference attended by hundreds of bankers and farmers; a land judging meet in which nearly 20,000 FFA members partici-
