Dr. Roy C. O'Donnell Named Acting President Of Mount Olive College

Dr. Roy C. O'Donnell, chairman of the department of English at Mount Olive College, has been named acting president of the College. He will assume his new duties January 1 and will serve until the return of President W. Burkette Raper from Florida on August 15, 1962. Dr. Raper has been granted a sabbatical leave to accept a Kellogg fellowship in higher education at Florida State University, Tallahassee. Dr. O'Donnell came to Mount

Olive College in September from Western Kentucky State College at Bowling Green where he was a professor in the department of English. He holds the B. S. and M. A. degrees from Auburn University, Alabama, and the Ph. D. degree from Peabody College in Nashville, Tennessee. Dr. O'Donnell, age 32, is a native of Alabama. His wife is the former Mary Lou Raper of Goldsboro, a teacher in the Goldsboro School system. Dr. O'Donnell has just been awarded a research grant in English by the United States Office of Education. His project will be based on research and analysis of the department of English at Mount Olive College.

Tobacco Acreage Lease Program Steps Are Given

Farmers throughout the blue-ribbon tobacco belt have expressed considerable interest in the provisions and regulations governing the leasing of tobacco acreage for the 1962 growing season.

The main provisions, as released by the County ASCS Office are as follows:

1. The lease agreement will be for a one-year period.
2. The owner and operator of the farm on which the tobacco is leased must both sign the lease.
3. The operator or owner of the leased farm must sign the lease.
4. The lease must be approved by the County Committee.
5. If the normal yield on the receiving farm is more than 10 per cent above the normal yield for the farm from which the allotment is leased, the amount to be planted will be reduced accordingly.
6. The current allotment plus the leased allotment cannot exceed 50 per cent of the cropland for the farm.
7. Leased allotment cannot be moved from one county to another.
8. The normal yield will be established by the County ASCS Committee taking into consideration the five year average (1956-1960), abnormal weather conditions are other factors that would affect the yield.
9. No lease agreements can be approved until 15 days after the mailing of the 1962 Allotment Notice for the farm.
10. The final date for filing a lease with the County ASCS Committee is April 1, 1962.
11. The maximum amount of leased allotment is five (5.0) acres. This can come from one or a number of farms.
12. Any farm can lease entire allotment as long as it does not lease more than five (5.0) acres to one farm.

Those who worked for the passage of the law which provides leasing of tobacco acreage pointed out that tobacco farmers with small acreages might find it more profitable to lease their tobacco rather than tend the crop. This is a pilot program and is in effect for only two years, 1962 and 1963. Should it be considered successful in these two years, there is a possibility that it will be extended.

The North Carolina Farm Bureau organization led the fight to secure this leasing type program after local Farm Bureau chapter had given their opinions that such a program would be profitable to tobacco farmers.

Veterans Receive

Veterans receiving pensions may save themselves inconvenience, embarrassment and money by notifying the Veterans Administration immediately when there is an increase in their annual income.

The amount of a veteran's pension is based on his income and the number in his family - his wife and children. If any of these factors change, his pension may change. Mr. J. D. DeRamus, Matteson-Salem, pointed out.

If the veteran receives additional income raising his total annual income or if he inherits money or sells property of material value, the facts should be reported at once to the VA.

For the same reason, should the veteran return to work, or should his family status change, such as divorce or death of his wife, marriage or death of a child, the birth of a child, or the marriage of the veteran, the VA should be advised immediately.

Failure of a veteran to report may result in VA overpayments to him. The veteran may be re-

quired to return some or all pension payments back to the first of the year. Mr. DeRamus emphasized.

However, if the veteran notifies the VA promptly of an income increase above the statutory limits, the VA will adjust or discontinue pension payments for that year and no over payment will result.
