Vo-Ag Teachers May Get Assistance Thru Industrial Education Center

Teachers of Vocational Agriculture in Wayne County may now secure instructional assistance through the Goldsboro Industrial Education Center. Wayne County was recently chosen as a pilot county for the Agricultural Technology Program. The program was discussed in detail in a meeting of Vocational-Agricultural Teachers, Principals, Superintendents, State Personnel, and Goldsboro Industrial Education Center representatives. Already agricultural teachers in the area are taking advantage of this program through organized programs of instruction for farmers in their respective school districts.

The cooperative program between the Industrial Education Center and Vocational Agriculture Teachers has been organized as a result of the rapid advances made in Agriculture and the need among Vo-Ag Teachers of technical help in offering this to date instruction to farmers. Through this program the Vo-Ag Teachers may obtain a specially trained person to instruct in a specified area. Provided the course consists of 10 or more hours. This enables farmers to attend organized classes heretofore not available to the local school. The major objective of this program is to provide technical level instruction which will increase skills and understanding of farmers and other agricultural workers.

Courses in which technical assistance may be obtained must be approved. Advisory committees composed of local agricultural leaders, working with the teacher of agriculture, determine what course is needed in the school district. This committee, the teacher of agriculture, and a representative from the industrial education center adopt a course outline which is used in providing the

'Hollywood's Answer To Communism' Is Applauded After 13-Station Telecast

Response to a television showing of "Hollywood's Answer to Communism" was described as "phenomenal, overwhelming and unprecedented" in a booklet just published by Deering Milliken, Inc.

The textile selling house and manufacturer concern sponsored the three-hour telecast over a 13 station network in North Carolina, South Carolina and Georgia.

Roger Milliken, a resident of Spartanburg and president of Deering Milliken, said letters, telegrams and telephone calls commenting on the program numbered more than 2,000, and the number was increasing daily. An estimated 1,500,000 persons witnessed the program, Mr. Milliken said.

"Hollywood's Answer to Communism" contains video taped speeches delivered in the Los Angeles Sports Arena and in the Hollywood Bowl. Principal speakers include Rep. Walter H. Judd (R-Minn.), Sen. Thomas J. Dodd (D-Conn.), Dr. Fred C. Schwarz, author of "You Can Trust A Communist (to do exactly as they say)" and president of the Christian Anti-Communism Crusade, and W. Cleon Skousen, formerly of the FBI and author of "The Naked Communist."

In an introduction, Mr. Milliken said "the most frightening thing in this response was the fear expressed by some to have their names publicly associated with this effort. But the overwhelming majority," he wrote, "some recognizing the possibility of reprisal, resolutely stood up to be counted."

Gen. Mark W. Clark, U. S. Army (Ret) and president of the Citadel at Charleston, S. C., is quoted in the booklet as writing, "You have struck a tremendous blow for freedom." Gen Clark said he wanted a film of the program shown to the entire Corps of Cadets.

CCC Corn To Be Available In N. C.

Alleviation of the shortage of corn to feeders, stockmen and poultrymen, will be affected by the movement of CCC corn into this State. According to Rufus Elks Jr., Office Mgr. for the Duplin Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service, the corn will be brought into the East Carolina Grain Company at Goldsboro, and Gurley Milling Company at Selma. This limitation of outlets he said, was brought about by the fact that only dealers on the Southern Railway who can handle 90 ton jumbo type cars which are unloaded from the bottom can receive these shipments.

Sales by these receiving dealers will be made at the local market price, but not less than the market price at the point of origin plus handling charges and reduced freight rates to destination. Other dealers in North Carolina are expected to qualify to receive and sell this CCC Corn as soon as the reduced freight rates are published for other lines.

These sales of corn which will be made in this state, according to Elks, will be by way of keeping faith with farmers who participated in the 1961 Feed Grain Program and who will participate in the 1962 Feed Grain Program, to the effect that farmers who do not participate in the program will not benefit at the expense of farmers who do agree to accept their rightful responsibility to reduce production. Movement of CCC Corn into this State was made necessary by the fact that in 1960 we produced in this State 88 million bushels of corn while we fed out or used 100 million bushels. In 1961, with the advent of the feed grain program, we cut our production to 67.2 million bushels while we fed out or used 100-102 million bushels. It is expected that this movement of corn in this State will have the effect of keeping the local market prices at or below the price support rate in this State. Corn price sup-

- Call the doctor at once.
- Help the patient take the position that is most comfortable for him. (This will probably be halfway between lying and sitting. He usually cannot breathe comfortably if he lies flat.)
- Do not attempt to carry or walk the patient without the doctor's supervision.
- Loosen tight clothing such as belts and collars.
- See that the patient does not become chilled, but do not induce sweating with too many blankets.
- Don't give drugs or anything to drink without the doctor's advice.
