4-H TRAINS FOR BETTER LIVING

Here in North Carolina where 4-H has grown from a idea into the world's largest rural youth organization, we point with pride to the imagination and ability of the pioneers who laid the foundation for an organization that has captivated the interest of people in all parts of the world.

Its greatest achievement is reflected in the lives of people better trained to serve as good citizens in their community.

North Carolina can proudly count its outstanding citizens, leaders in agriculture, business, industry, politics and education who have come from its rural community. Many of these leaders have attributed their present eminence to the state-to-ward leadership which they were given in the 4-H Clubs in North Carolina.

For more than fifty years our young people through 4-H Club work have been learning by doing, striving to daily live the 4-H motto, "To Make the Best Better", as they enjoy play and recreation as well as interesting worthwhile work as they join together in building both personal character and group citizenship. About one of every five rural boys and girls eligible for membership in 4-H is engaged in the varied activities of this program

4-H continues to open new doors of opportunity for farm boys and girls and serves to broaden their horizons. In addition to teaching better farm and home practices in agriculture and homemaking, 4-H offers boys and girls an opportunity to participate in 4-H judging contests, team demonstrations, public speaking, and various other activities. Through the Wildlife Conservation Program an opportunity is offered to learn more about wildlife and natural resources and to participate in a State 4-H Wildlife Conservation Conference.

Through the medium of state, regional and national events, 4-H members are offered an opportunity to come in contact with the outstanding leaders in various professional fields. In the health improvement program every 4-H member in the state is expected to conduct a health improvement project. In the farm and home safety and the automotive care and safety programs they have an opportunity to participate in programs designed to eliminate traffic and farm and home accidents. In the state-wide observance of 4-H Sunday and in practically all 4-H programs and activities, 4-H members learn the importance of spiritual growth and development in the lives of individuals, communities, states, and nations.

It would be impossible to describe the total impact of this program on the lives of millions of boys and girls who have participated in the various activities of the 4-H program. But so long as the 4-H program is geared to fit the economic, social, physical and spiritual growth and development needs of the individual and the needs of the community, 4-H will continue to serve in helping young people grow into better individuals in a better community, in a better state and in a better world.

What Is National 4-H Club Week?

4-H Youth in Duplin County will observe National 4-H Club Week, March 3 to 10. The young people are among the 2,296,000 4-H'ers who belong to about 93,000 clubs in urban, suburban, and rural areas throughout the United States.

Among the special 4-H Week activities planned for Duplin County are: News articles featuring Community 4-H Clubs in Duplin County with special emphasis on the type of programs 4-H'ers are conducting through a United Community effort.

The week has a number of local and national aims - among them: To give members a chance to measure progress and set new goals, influence more youth to join or form 4-H clubs, acquaint more parents with the organization and enlist their aid; encourage more persons to volunteer as local leaders, stress learning to live and serve

cooperatively with others, and recognize the major part played by friends of 4-H.

Sharing honors with club members in all states will be nearly 310,700 men and women who serve as unpaid volunteer leaders, and guide 4-H work in local communi-

ties throughout the 50 states and Puerto Rico. Forty of these volunteer leaders are located in Duplin County. These leaders, after receiving training from the Agricultural Extension Service, are responsible for guiding club work in 17 Community 4-H Clubs.

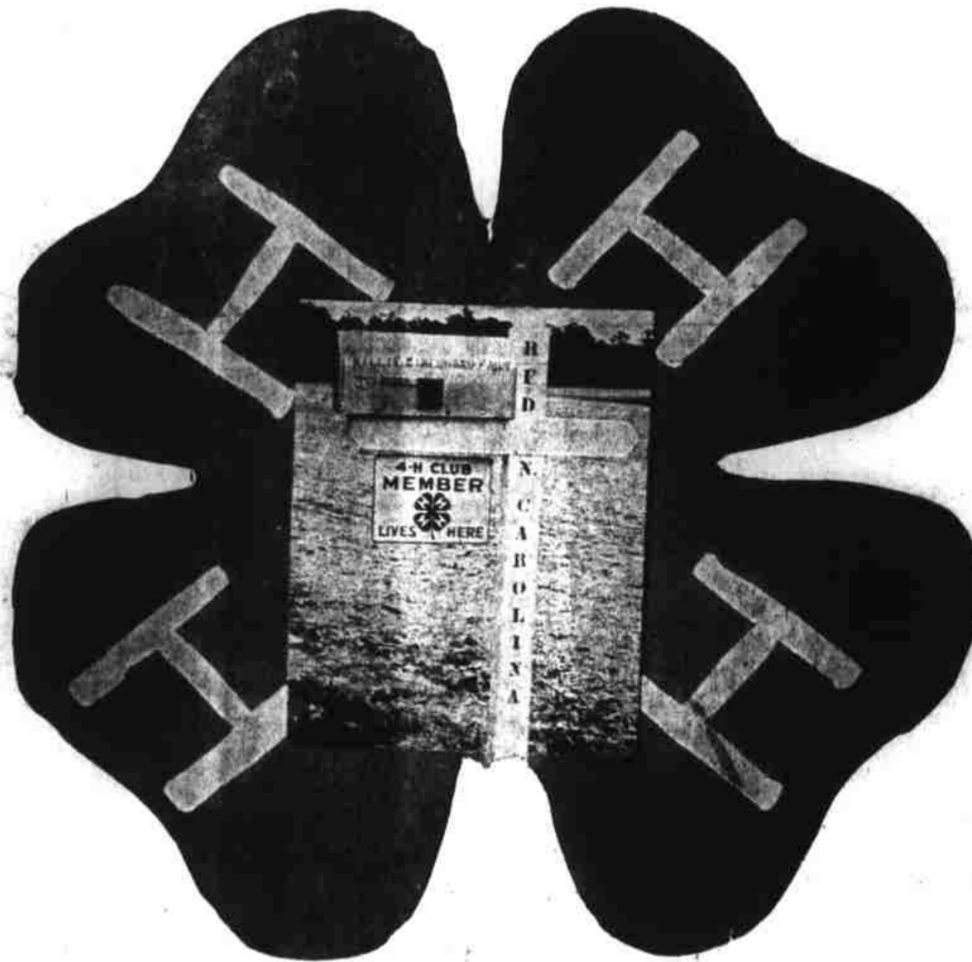
