## Farmers Advised How Cattle Program Can Be Worked In With Tobacco Farming

Assistant County Agricultural Agent James "Pete" Patterson, Beef Cattle Specialist with the N. C. Agriculture Extension Service, was the guest speaker at the last in a series of beef cattle meetings held at the Agriculture Building in Kenansville. 75 Duplin County farmers attended the two meetings, states Ralph Sasser, Assistant County Agricultural Agent. The subject covered by Patterson was how "Beef Cattle Could Supplement a Tobacco Farmer's Income". He briefly covered the different beef operations such as cow-calf program selling the calves on feeder sales, pure-bred program and the different beef cattle feeding operations.

In his discussion Patterson stated that most farmers have some feed left in the fields after harvest that

could well be utilized by beef cattle. He strongly recommended a stocker cattle program for a majority of interest farmers in eastern North Carolina that feels that beef cattle has a place in their farm. A stocker program consist of buying light weight calves, 300 pounds to 450 pounds of uniform grade in September, October, or November. These calves are then marketed in special stocker sales the following spring. Sasser, states that all meetings on swine and beef cattle were well received. Duplin business concerns cooperated in conducting these meetings in every respect. Door prizes for the last of the beef cattle meetings were donated by Blizard and Holmes Feed Mill, Beaulville F. C. X. and Well's Livestock Market at Wallace. Wells gave a 400 lb. Hereford steer. The steer was won by Nathan Scott in the Pleasant Grove Community. Scott had attended six of the 8 hour classes and both of the beef cattle meetings.

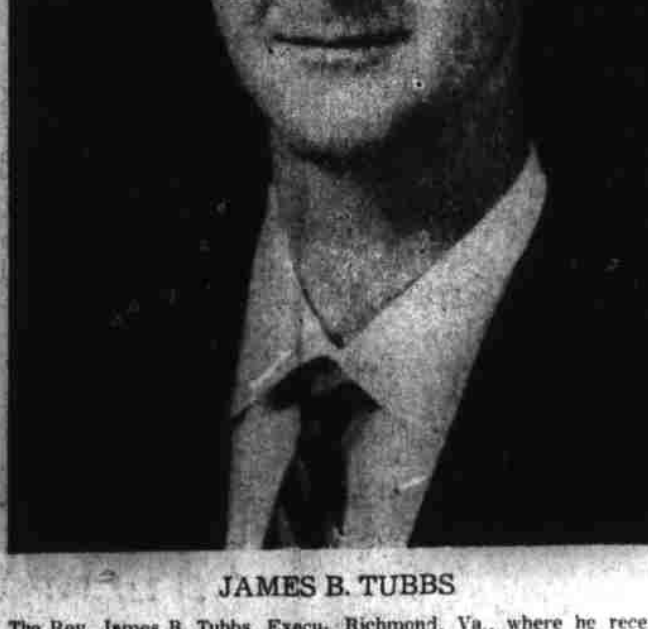
