C., where he has been assigned to Company C, 3rd Battalion, 1st Training Regiment of the U. S. Army Training Center, Infantry.

During his basic training he will be introduced to a wide variety of infantry skills, along with intensive physical conditioning. He will attend classes in the traditions of the service, character, guidance, and the role of the Army in the world today. Many of his instructors are combat veterans of World War II and the Korean conflict.

Fort Jackson uses the U. S. Army's TRAINFIRE method of teaching rifle marksmanship. Simulated actual battle conditions, TRAINFIRE enables the Soldier to become a better rifleman in less time. Under the program, the trainee fires at pop-up targets at unknown distances on terrain which duplicates combat areas.

Other highlights of his intensive basic training schedule include squad tactics, bayonet drill, hand-to-hand combat, and a night problem against an "aggressor" force. He will also crawl the infiltration course while live machine-gun fire pops overhead.

During his seventh week of training, he lives in the field under conditions similar to a combat zone. Here, moving over rough terrain, he has a chance to participate in realistic combat situations and to apply his newly acquired skills.

Basic training is climaxed by a graduation review before the commanding general of Fort Jackson. Outstanding performances are recognized in a ceremony that is open to parents and invited guests.

## Wayne Dairy Has New Milk Carton

Wayne Dairy announced today the completion of installing new equipment over the past week end to put in use a new type plastic-coated Milk Carton.

The machinery installed this past weekend is for the half-gallon size cartons - They have on order new equipment for quart, pint and half-pints that is scheduled to be installed the week end of July 16.

"We have waited a long time for this new carton, which out dates every other wax or plastic-coated carton on the market," Mr. Cline, Wayne Dairy Manager, said.

One type of Plastic-coated Milk Carton has been in some N. C. markets for 6 or 7 years, but these have met with some consumer objection. "We feel this carton was well worth waiting for," Mr. Cline continued, "because it overcomes all of the objections consumers had toward the other type plastic-coated carton."


The new carton, known as "Brightplastic" has a gable top and thus sheds impurities - It is easier to open, pours like a pitcher and easy to reseal. Of course, there is no clipping or wax particles with the new carton.

"Although we will be the first in N. C. with this new style carton," stated Mr. Cline, "other dairies will soon follow, as most dairies in the State have been waiting for this new carton to become available."

"Although this new Plastic Carton is more expensive, in cost of milk will continue to be the same as our customers", concluded Mr. Cline, "and we will still have a choice for our customers, either 'class or 'Brightplastic."
