Tourists May Be Smugglers

Souvenir - toting tourists may be unwitting smugglers of deadly enemies of the American farmer.

"Insects, plant diseases and other plant pests often hide in fruits, vegetables, bulbs, seeds and soil," warn USDA experts. "Travelers coming to the U. S. should not risk carrying these pests and diseases in their baggage."

One tourist was bringing a small packet of herbs as a gift to a friend for brewing tea. Hitchhiking in the herbs was a small

bliss on nursery stock and in shipments of grain and cattle, but more than half of them are brought in passenger luggage.

In the 1960-61 fiscal year, USDA officials, cooperating with customs officials, inspected nearly 23 million pieces of incoming baggage. They seized more than 323,000 lots of prohibited plant materials.

In the same period the inspectors intercepted more than 145,000 pounds of prohibited meats and meat products in mail and passenger baggage.

Numerous souvenirs - such as dolls with heads carved from dried fruit - have been found carrying serious plant pests. Agricultural inspectors seize and destroy more than half a ton of foreign meat arriving at New York City in passenger baggage and mail during the average month. Most of this meat is in small packages, weighing only a few pounds each.

"Plant and animal pests and diseases cost Americans \$9 billion (by a year in damage to crops, livestock and ornamental plants)," note the USDA specialists. "Many of these pests - including insects, mites, snails, nematodes and plant and animal diseases - aren't native to America. They have been brought to this country from abroad."

The pests come on ships and planes, on mud stuck to automo-

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
