## Announce Marriage

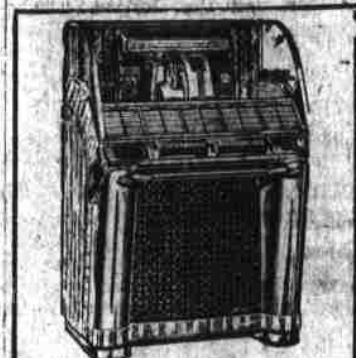
