Strother Speaks To Rurians

Jake Strother, of Kinston, was guest speaker at the regular monthly meeting of the Pink Hill Rurians Club in the school cafeteria Thursday night. He was introduced by Tom Davis. Strother, who spent 11 years in France and England during the month of June, discussed his impressions of what he saw and emphasized the potential of the European Common Market. He declared it has brought unprecedented prosperity to Europe in the past three years, and will eventually include the British Commonwealth of nations. He observed that America's need to cooperate with the agency would grow as it grows, and that unless the U. S. can compete it could be in serious trouble. He noted that Eastern Carolina tobacco is one of the most important items involved in competitive foreign trade.

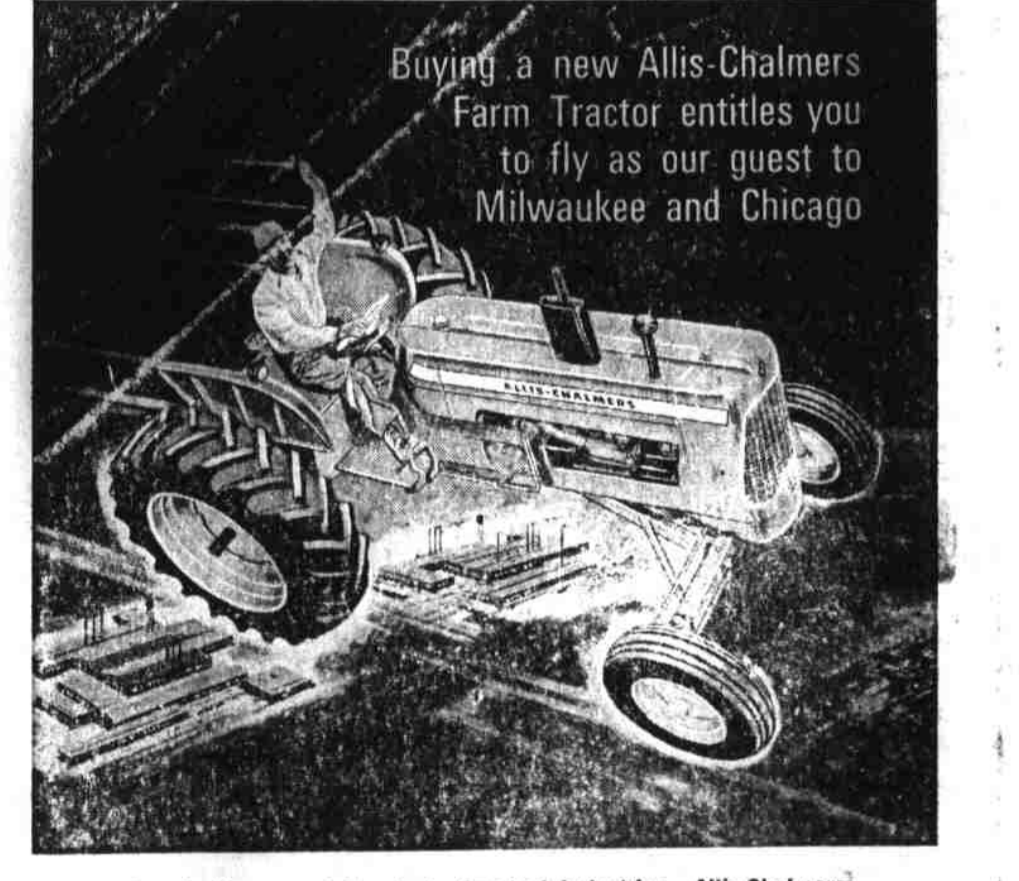
