**YDC Candidate National Committeewoman**

Monroe - A Union County native, Joyce Lathan, who held Y. D. C. offices from the college campus to the state level, today announced her candidacy for National Committeewoman of the Young Democratic Clubs of North Carolina.

Miss Lathan, who was chosen as one of the "Ten Outstanding Young Democrats of North Carolina" last year, said in making her announcement, "I deeply believe in the platform, political philosophy, ideals, and the principles of government espoused by the Democratic Party. For the past several months, I have been giving consideration to becoming a candidate for the office of National Committeewoman. Many people from all across the State, have pledged their support to me, in the event that I become a candidate. I have, therefore, decided to seek the office and will campaign vigorously for the post, which will be decided at the State Convention of the Young Democratic Clubs, beginning in Greensboro, October 11, 1962. If elected to represent the women of the Young Democratic Clubs of North Carolina on the national level, I promise to use all of my ability and energy in promoting and enhancing the principles and platform of the Democratic Party."

Miss Lathan has served the Democratic Party and the Young Democratic Clubs on the college, precinct, county, district and state levels. She served as president of the Pfeiffer College Young Democrats Club in 1958 and 1959. Miss Lathan was State Installation and Past Presidents' Night Chairman for the 1959 State Installation Program held on the Pfeiffer College campus. When Governor Frank Clement of Tennessee spoke at Salisbury in March of 1958, Miss Lathan was in charge of registration and served as chief

hostess at a reception given in honor of the visiting Governor. Her work as president of the Pfeiffer College Y. D. C. was recognized when she was honored by the State Y. D. C. as "Young Democrat of the Month" in 1958. She was selected secretary of the Eighth Congressional District Young Democratic Clubs in 1960-1961. She was appointed Chairman of the State Womens Activities Committee for 1961.

I have sufficient pre-ginning equipment to remove most of the trash and dirt before the cotton goes through the gin stand. Gin saw teeth will chew up trash into small pepper trash which is impossible to remove without excessive waste of lint and damage to the cotton. I have also adequate heat which will be controlled in order to give a better quality of cotton.

I am using the very heaviest grade of cotton bagging and new cotton ties which will give you more weight.

My gin is located 1 mile south of Clinton on Highway 421 near Highway 701.

I will operate the gin and give service each night as long as necessary.
