Agent is Mrs. Mae Spicer, who is doing a wonderful job with various clubs of Duplin County. Under her direction we have discussed many interesting topics, as taking advantage of every opportunity to meet civic groups, F. T. A. and other organizations, for women to tell the H. D. story; encourage participation in community affairs; personal contact with non-members; and information and materials available.

City hostesses have been available at different times to tell of the work of their club. Our club has sponsored fashion shows by placing their models in public places. Our public relations chairman for the past three years has put forth an effort

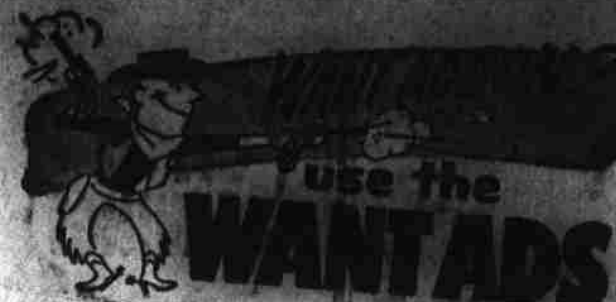
to present facts on the goal: "Each one reach one."

Our club has made donations to the polio fund, heart fund, cancer drive and retarded children's home. We have visited Mrs. Whaley's rest home at Kenansville for the past two years and took food and gifts at Christmas. We have made and sold quilts for the benefit of our club; held bake sales, served meals to bereaved families; sent cards and flowers to the sick.
