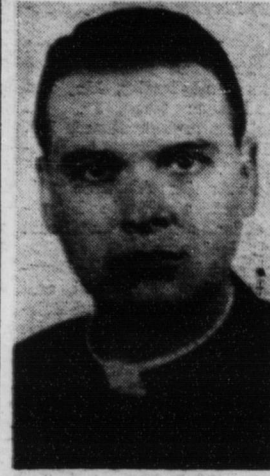

Tax Rate Stays Same

Davie County will maintain the same tax rate this year of .80c per hundred dollars valuation. This tax rate was maintained even though a record budget for the county was adopted by the commissioners at their regular meeting on Tuesday.

H. R. Hendrix, Jr., chairman of the Davie County Board of Commissioners, also announced that all the county offices would henceforth remain open during the dinner hour each day.

"We feel that keeping the county offices open during the dinner hour is warranted for those unable to transact business at other times" said Mr. Hendrix.

Elwood E. W. Benson, deceased March 2, 1965
David Vance Price Williams, deceased April 15, 1965
Hugh Jackson Benson, deceased May 21, 1965

David Williams was the son of a former pastor of the church, Rev. George Williams. David was manager of the Nuclear Physics Laboratories at Babcock and Wilcox Company's Nuclear Development Center, Lynchburg, Va. He was killed April 5, 1965 on a rain slick road when the compact car in which he was riding to work crashed in a head-on collision with another vehicle. He was known throughout the world for his work in the nuclear field.

He is survived by three children and his wife, the former Betty Chandler of Salisbury. Rev. Williams, his father, was serving as pastor when the present church was built.

Wood Benson has two surviving sisters in Cooleeemee, Mrs. Cora Morton and Mrs. Meekie Thompson.

Hugh Benson was struck by a car on May 7, and died May 12 at Baptist Hospital.

Burlington Employees Share \$6.1 Million In Vacation Bonuses

Potneck Road Barn Burns

A small barn on the Frank Grant farm on Potneck Road was destroyed by fire early Monday.

Woolleaf Fire Chief Ira Benson said the building was covered with flames when firemen arrived at 2 A. M. He said the blaze started from lightning. Benson did not have an estimate covering the extent of the loss.

Greensboro, N. C. — Vacation bonus payments to wage employees of Burlington Industries, Inc., totaled approximately \$6.1 million in the company's 1965 fiscal year, Charles A. McLendon, vice president in charge of personnel, announced today.

Of this total, some \$3.7 million was paid to employees of the diversified textile firm in July and August, he said. Bonuses paid last Christmas totaled \$2.4 million.

Over 50,000 employees at Burlington plants in 16 states receive the payments, with the individual amounts depending on length of service.

The bonuses are paid in addition to benefits provided by Burlington's Profit Sharing Retirement Plan for non-salaried employees. Members of the plan, in 1964, had approximately \$5.2 million to their accounts, which was equivalent to about 4.2 per cent of the member employee wages.

ORLANDO, FLA. — Master Sergeant Van A. Swicegood Jr., son of Mrs. Annie G. Swicegood of R. D. 4, Mocksville, N. C., has been decorated with the U. S. Air Force Commendation Medal at Orlando, ABF, Fla.

Sergeant Swicegood was awarded the medal for meritorious service as a material supervisor at McGuire AFB, N. J.

He is now with an Air Rescue Service (ARS) unit at Orlando. His unit supports the ARS mission of operating a global search and rescue network for downed aircraft, recovery of astronauts, and assistance during disasters.

The sergeant attended Cooleeemee (N. C.) High School. His wife, Betty, is the daughter of Mrs. Mary Ponds of Granite Quarry, N. C. (NOTE TO EDITOR: Sergeant Swicegood listed father as deceased.)
