**Words Explained For Veterans**

The words "compensation" and "pension," as used by the Veterans Administration to describe monthly payments to veterans or their dependants, are not synonymous, Judson D. DeRamus, Manager of the North Carolina VA Regional Office, advised today.

DeRamus explained that "compensation" is payment made because of a service-connected disability; that is, the disease, injury or death for which the payments are being made either originated or was aggravated in active military service. There is a difference in the rate of compensation for wartime and for peacetime service. The financial condition of the recipient is not taken into consideration.

"Pension," on the other hand, is paid on the basis of need for disabilities or death due to non-service-connected causes. The income of the recipient has a direct bearing on whether or not the pension is payable and on the amount of payment.

Information concerning either benefit is available by mail, phone or personal inquiry at any VA office, DeRamus said.

**The Veterans Corner**

**EDITOR'S NOTE:** Below are authoritative answers by the Veterans Administration to some of the many current questions from former servicemen and their families. Further information on veterans benefits may be obtained at any VA office.

**Q**—As the re-married widow of a veteran, I have never applied for pension because I am not eligible. However, the veteran's son in my care may be eligible. Should I apply for a pension for him?

**A**—You are right in assuming you are not eligible for pension because of your remarriage. But your remarriage does not affect the eligibility of the veteran's son, and you should apply for a pension for him. Your nearest VA office will give you forms and assistance.

**Q**—Can you tell me how many veterans of the Spanish-American War are still alive?

**A**—There were only 17,000 Spanish-American War veterans alive on January 1, 1965, and it is estimated that number will have shrunk to about 15,000 by July 1, 1965. The average age of these veterans is 86.5 years and there are more than 1,000 of them over ninety years of age according to VA records.

**Q**—I am 82 years old and my father was a Civil War veteran. I would like to know if I am entitled to a pension because of his service?

**A**—The Veterans Administration makes compensation or pension payments to children of veterans who are under age 18 (or age 21 if they are attending a recognized school). Should the child be unable for physical or mental reasons to be self supporting the pension may be continued after the stipulated age limits. There is no general compensation or pension payment to normal children over 18 (or 21).

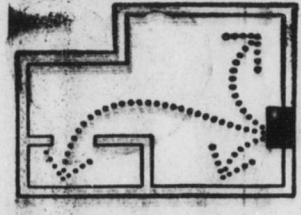

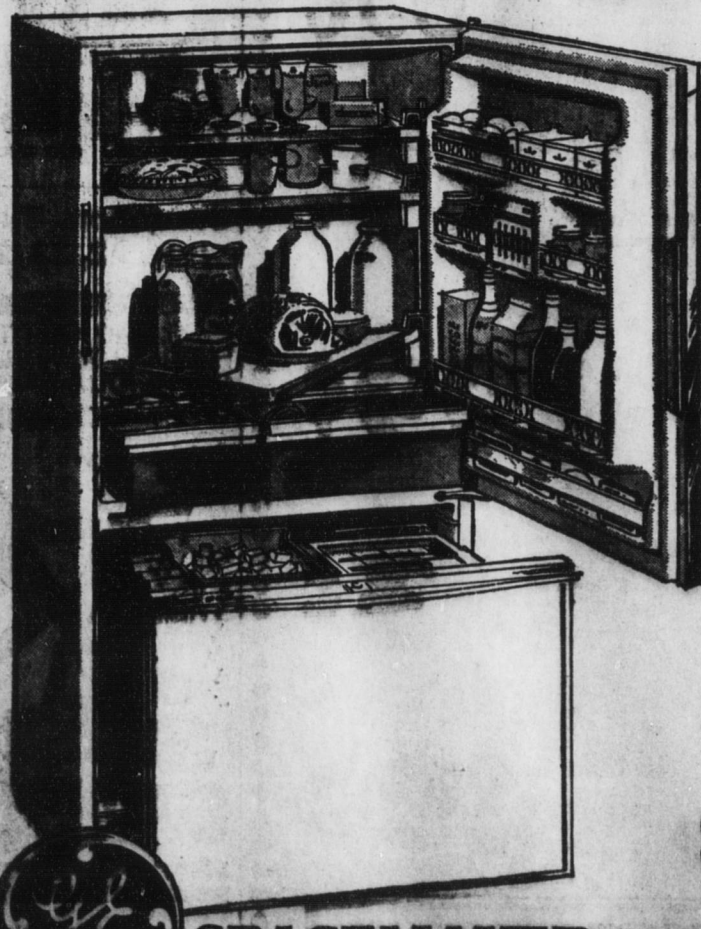
