N. C. Heart Program

CHAPEL HILL — The North Carolina Heart Association Senior Research Investigatorship program at Bowman Gray, UNC, and Duke University medical schools, inaugurated as a five-year program in 1962, has been extended for an additional five years to 1972.

The Investigatorship program, which provides \$12,000 a year to a Senior Research Investigator at each of three medical schools in the state, will cost the North Carolina Heart Association \$360,000 during the ten years, according to Dr. Daniel L. Young, of Chapel Hill, State Heart Association president.

The purpose of the Investigatorship program is to provide continuing support for qualified investigators in the broad fields of cardiovascular physiology or disease in order to strengthen research and teaching in these fields at the three medical schools.

Recipients of the Investigatorship awards are selected by the deans of the medical schools and approved by the state heart group's board of directors. Senior Research Investigators since 1962 at the three institutions have been Dr. Roscoe R. Robinson, Duke; Dr. Herbert S. Harned, Jr., UNC; and Dr. Joseph Whitley, Bowman Gray.
