Mrs. Robold's home was beautifully decorated for the Christmas meeting.

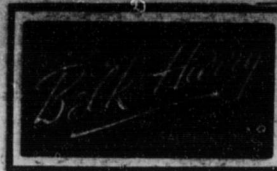

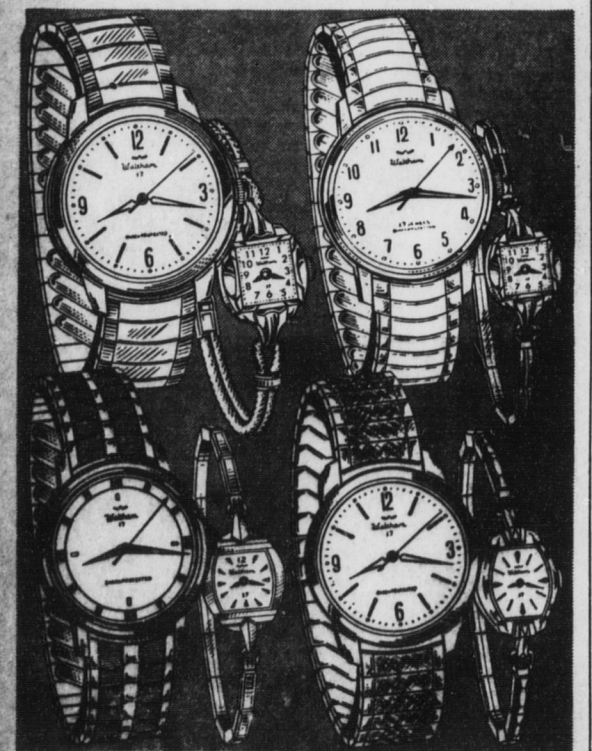
