Homecoming Date Set For Lutherans

Homecoming will be held at the Holy Cross Lutheran Church Sunday June 5. The pastor of the church, Rev. Jack Rhyne will be in charge of the annual observance. Sunday School begins at 9:45 A. M. MEDICARE NEWS

Davie County residents who have a 65th birthday in 1966 will be protected by medicare's medical insurance at the earliest date only if they apply during the three months before they become 65.

Robert C. Thomas, social security district manager in Salisbury, said today that if they wait to apply for monthly benefits or medicare until the month they become 65 or later, their protection under medicare doctor - bill insurance will not begin until some months after they are 65.

Mr. Thomas explained that each person who reaches 65 on or after January 1, 1966, has a seven - month period during which he may enroll for the supplementary medical insurance plan, but the effective date of this protection depends on the date of his application. This individual enrollment period begins with the third month before he is 65 and ends in the third month after his 65th birthday. As an example, Mr. Thomas said, if an application is not filed until the month after a person becomes 65, medical insurance coverage does not begin until the first day of the second month after he applies.

Mr. Thomas urged everyone who has a 65th birthday approaching, including those who continue working, to file their applications at the social security office two or three months before their 65th birthday. This early action will guarantee full hospital and medical insurance protection beginning on the first day of the month they become 65 (but no earlier than July 1, 1966).

Applicants should bring birth certificates, he added, but if this is not available, the social security office will advise them how they can establish their age.

The social security office in Salisbury is located at 105 Corriher Avenue and the telephone number is 633-6470. Office hours Monday through Thursday are from 8:45 A. M. until 5:00 P. M. and on Fridays thru June from 8:45 A. M. until 9:00 P. M.

MOCKSVILLE -- Davie County Hospital is complying with the Civil Rights Act of 1964, hospital trustees said this week.

The trustees issued a statement following an inspection last week by representatives of the Department of Health Education and Welfare.

The announcement said that no one will, on the grounds of race, color or national origin, be denied any services or facilities of the Davie County Hospital. Room assignments are being made on this basis.

Paul Neil, Jr., administrator, said compliance with the act is necessary for the hospital to be approved for Medicare and to continue to receive federal funds from other sources.

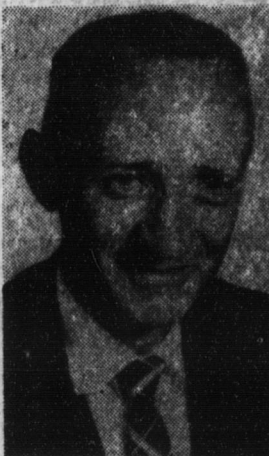

Crossnore Teacher Is Honored

Walter Glenn Jarvis, teacher and assistant principal in the Crossnore Elementary School, was presented the first annual Terry Sanford award Wednesday May 25 for being adjudged "the most creative and innovative educator in the state."

Jarvis and three honorable mention winners were honored at a banquet. An awards committee cited Jarvis for his contributions to the improvements in the administration and the teaching in the Crossnore school.

The awards amounted to \$300 for Jarvis and \$100 each to the honorable mention winners. They are Mrs. Mary Mitchell, special education teacher in the Lincoln Junior-Senior High School, Chapel Hill; Miss Gladys Curran, teacher in the Governor Morehead School, Raleigh and Miss Louisa M. Rosemond teacher in the Morehead School Durham.

Jarvis was instrumental in adapting and introducing a special reading program team teaching in the seventh and eighth grades and an ungraded primary system. The installation of the programs in a small mountain school where 180 students board and live-in is considered a unique accomplishment by his fellow teachers and other educators. The Terry Sanford award was established by donations from members of the teaching profession in recognition of the educational contributions of the former governor. The fund is administered by the North Carolina Education Association in cooperation with the North Carolina Teachers Association.

He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. J. F. Jarvis of Cooleeemee.

John M. Groce is retiring from the position of Davie County Tax Appraiser as of May 31st. He has served in this position since 1952.

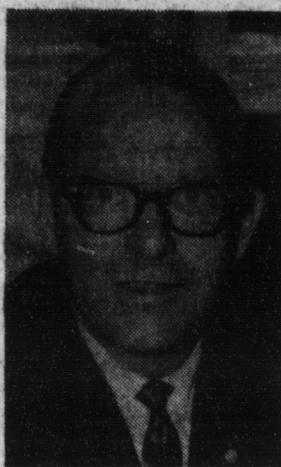
