WINSTON - SALEM -The third annual summer conference for ministers will be held July 24-28 on the Wake Forest University campus.

The conference provides a week of study, worship and fellowship, with emphasis on a preaching workshop and lecture in fields related to the needs and opportunities of the church today.

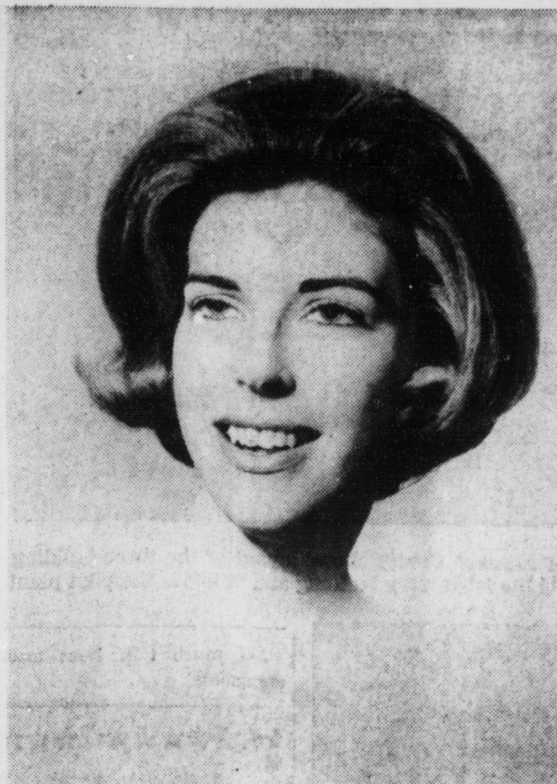
L. L. Hollingsworth, college chaplain, will be conference director. The program is offered as part of the college's summer school program with cooperation of the chaplain's

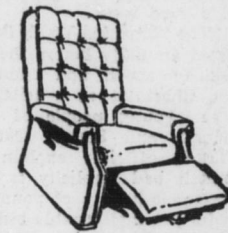

Angell's lecture series will be on the general topic "Theology and Evangelism Today." He will explain the faith of the church and the task of evangelism in the light of today's problems and opportunities.

Hollingsworth said registration for the conference is limited and urged interested ministers to make reservations with him as soon as possible. Conferences during the past two summers have attracted 35 to 40 persons.

Those attending pay a small registration fee and provide their own meals. The university will provide rooms, library and recreation facilities.
