Gilbert Lee Boger has announced that he will be a candidate for re-election to the North Carolina House of Representatives.

Boger said, "Because of the excellent cooperation I have received from the people of this district, I have decided to offer myself as a candidate for the House again. I feel that the experience I gained during the last session should enable me to do a better job if the people of this district should see fit to return me in 1969."

Boger, 40, is a native of Davie County and a graduate of Mocksville High School. He is a member of Farmington Masonic Lodge, the N.C. Farm Bureau and Bethlehem Methodist Church.

He is married to the former Maxine Smith. They have three children.

Boger's committee assignments last term included agriculture, appropriations, roads, irrigation and drainage, manufacturers and labor, public buildings and grounds, senatorial districts and wildlife resources.
