

Mizell Will Speak At Masonic Picnic

Congressmen Gilmer D. Mizell, Representative of the Fifth Congressional District, will deliver the annual Masonic Picnic address at noon Thursday, August 14. This will be the 89th Annual Masonic Picnic for Davie County.

The planned program for that day is expected to draw a large crowd into the historic grounds to carry on the tradition of the second Thursday in August set many years ago when the

event originated as a means of providing funds for the Oxford Orphanage. Proceeds from this annual event go to this orphanage.

The R. C. Lee Riding Devices, long a feature of this annual event, will operate each night during the week of the picnic, along with other midway attractions.

C. Roy Anderson, Master of the Mocksville Masonic Lodge, has appointed Robert Hendricks

to serve as general chairman of the event. Lester P. Martin and Mr. Anderson will serve as assistant chairmen along with Richard Brock and T. F. Cornatzer, Masters of the Farmington and Advance Masonic Lodges respectively. Mr. Hendricks, assisted by these men and various committee members, has lined up one of the greatest events in the long and colorful history

of the Mocksville Masonic Picnic.

George Martin, program chairman, has lined up a program that includes the Davie County High School Band and the Oxford Orphanage Glee Club. The program is to be held under the arbor and is scheduled to get underway at 11:30 a.m.

The afternoon and evening program will feature music by

Clyde Lakey and his String Band.

The famed picnic dinner will be spread under the dinner arbor immediately following the conclusion of the morning program.

Last year an estimated 10,000 persons paid admission into the picnic grounds during the day and evening sessions of the annual event. Officials are making plans to handle even a larger crowd this year.

He was appointed to Franklinville United Methodist Church, Franklinville, N. C. in 1966. He was scheduled to continue his pastorate until June, 1970 prior to begin reappointed to Cooleemee.
