
Seaford's 30 Points Nets Title for Rebs



Tony Seaford fired in a career-high 30 points in leading Davie County's Rebels over North Stanly and to the North Piedmont Conference championship.

NEW LONDON-Davie County's Rebels wrapped up their second straight regular-season basketball championship in the North Piedmont Conference last night with an 80-71 victory over North Stanly's Comets.

North Stanly's girls also clinched the North Piedmont championship with a 40-30 win over Davie in the first game of the twin bill.

Tony Seaford had the hot hand for the Davie boys with 30 points, his career high. James "Jingles" Ijames tossed in 22 for the Rebels.

The victory gave Davie County a 13-2 conference mark and a 14-5 overall record. Secondplace South Iredell's regular-season titles hopes were ended last night with 71-66 overtime loss to West Rowan. The Vikings are 12-4 in the league.

Davie gradually pulled away from the Comets, leading 22-21

after one quarter, 46-39 at half-time, and 66-61 after three peri-ods. The Rebels outscored the home team by 14-10 in the final

Eddie Ingram paced North Stanly with 28 points. Roger Huneycutt added 14. The Comets now stand 2-13 in the NPC and 4-13 overall.

The North Stanly girls continued their domination of the regular-season race in the NPC. "This is our fourth year in a row to win the North Piedmont in the regular season," exclaimed Coach Lonnie Chandler. "It's our fifth championship in eight years," he added.

"This is probably our quick-est team and they work together better than any team I've had,' Chandler added.

His girls hit 17 off 43 field-goal attempts for 39.5 per cent as compared to 12 of 45 for 26.7 per cent for Davie. Each team hit six free throws.


North Stanly jumped off to an 8-0 lead and held the lead throughout the contest. Malinda Stoker led the winners with 18 points, and Janice Markland tallied 12 for Davie.

North Stanly is now 14-1 in the league and 16-1 overall. Davie stands 11-4 in the NPC and 14-5 and 14-5 for all games.
