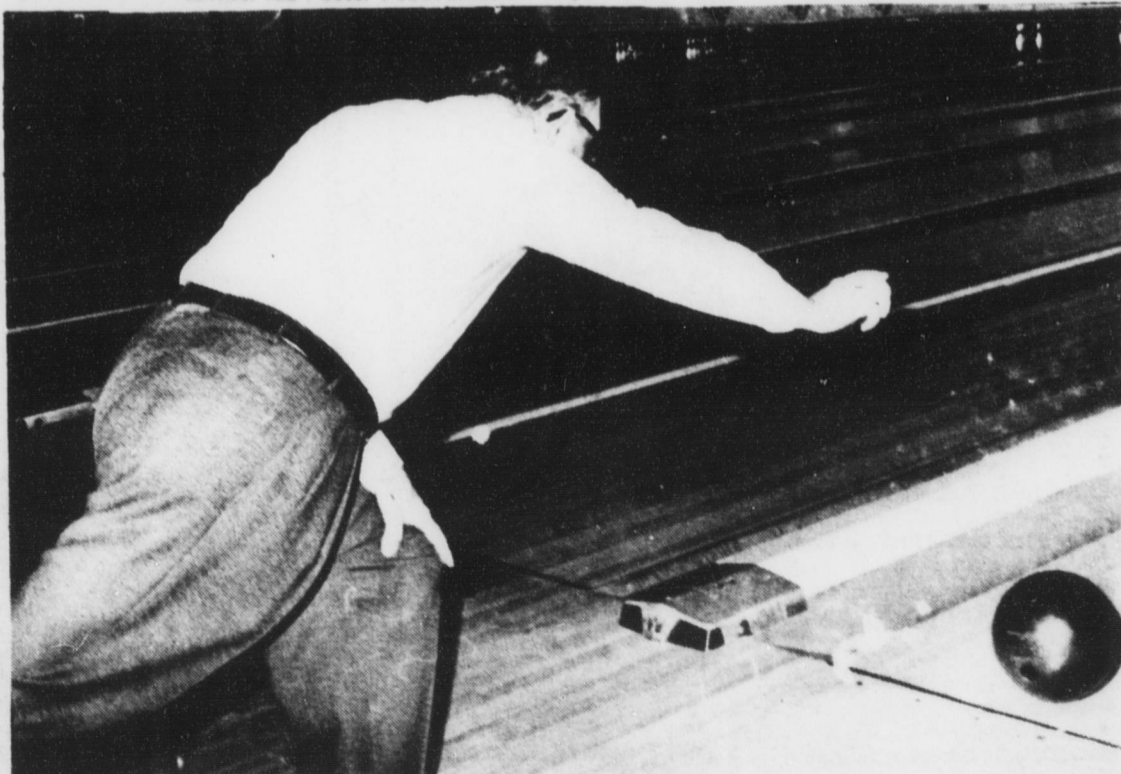
The club is thankful to Woodleaf Lanes for having us as guests and giving our first bowling lesson. Refreshments were also served to the approximately 35 members attending.
