

before the May 2, primary. Dr. R. F. Kemp, Chairman of the Davie County Board of Elections, said that the registrar of the various county precincts will be at the precinct voting place on Saturday from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Saturday, April 25th, will be challenge day. There will be three separate elections in Davie County on May 2nd. A Democratic Primary vote; a Republican Primary vote; and a vote for members of

the board of education.

Only registered Democrats may vote in the Democratic Primary and only registered Republicans may vote in the Republican Primary. Every registered voter, regardless of

party affiliation, may vote in the non-partisan board of edu-cation election. All citizens who have not yet registered, are urged to do so in order to exercise your rights to write in the upcoming election vote in the upcoming election
